

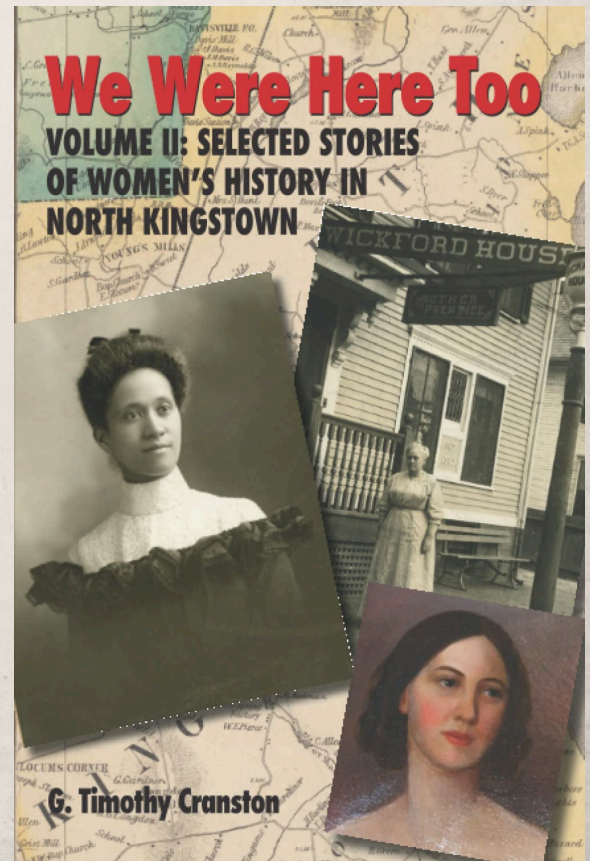
# WOMEN'S HISTORY WALKING TOUR

Wickford was among a handful of unique places during the colonial and post-colonial period where women were allowed to step out of the very traditional “family, hearth, and home” role that they were required to assume in just about every other place in New England during that same period. Here, all the men were at sea or actively involved in the shipbuilding trades, and for practical reasons to allow the village to function, women could own property, run businesses, and be community leaders. Join Tim Cranston as he walks the village and examines the lives of some of these remarkable women who dared to be more than a wife and mother. The walk, which starts at 10AM, begins and ends at the Town Wharf at the end of Main Street in Wickford.
